Athenagoras, Both vowed to make historic concessions in the drive to unite what the Pope called their "sister churches" after nine centuries of actism.

In the first papal visit to Turkey in 12 centuries, the slen-der Pope, 69, and the tall, whiteheurded patriarch, \$1, met in a tree-shaded court to exchange the symbolic kiss of brotherhood and good will.

They had met before in Jurusalem on the Pope's Hely Lead visit in January, 1964.

Pope Paul arrived by a Pan American joliner from Rome to be greeted by Turkey's highest officials and top religious leaders of the Moslem majority and Christian and Jewish minor-

In closed political talks with President Cardet Sunay, Pra-mer Suleyman Demirel and Foreign Minister Ihaan Sabri Calgiyangil, the Pope discussed the Middle East crisis and was given Turkey's views on the Cypras dispose,
